## With Remembrance

It is with deep sadness to report that Solomon Volen, N3UBY, became a silent key on February 16, 2023. He was 96. As a longtime member of Holmesburg he supported many club activities both as a participant and making sure that other members were well nourished and able to do things that they enjoyed doing.

Sol grew up in Strawberry Mansion and was a WWII veteran in the Army from 1943-1947. He served in the Philippines. He owned a bar on Spring Garden Street for many years and later started a full line vending machine business and branched out into office coffee services.

He never stopped his life of service and spent his retirement volunteering at various organizations such as Red Cross Disaster Services, the USO, the Reading Terminal, JRA, etc. At the time he was helping to rebuild computers for disadvantaged children and working at a food bank. He was one of 10 national finalists for Applebee's ® America's 'Real Hero'.

Sol was a member of 3 war veterans groups, 3 ham radio clubs and 5 coin clubs. He was well read, very knowledgeable and had various collections. His

## **Meeting Location**

# Rules of the Big Left Toe \*by Eric Nichols KL7AJ

1) 10:1 throw-out rule. If you have two resistors in parallel, and one of them is 10X or greater the value of the other one, simply ignore the higher value resistor.

2) A yard is a meter. If you're measuring out antenna wire, just remember the 40 meter band is about 40 yards, and if you include the end effect of a dipole, the difference is even less. (I like to add 10%)

3) Pi is 3. from a practical standpoint, in most electronics work, except for instrumentation, 3 is a fair substitute for Pi.

4) One RC time constant is a 2/3 drop in voltage. Officially, it's 63% of the initial voltage, but for building 555 timers and such, just use the 2/3 drop rule. (or 1/3 remainder)

5) Half power is 3dB.....very close. 3/4 power is 2 dB down. Not quite as close, but close enough

6) Radio travels one foot per nanosecond. Semi close

7) Radio takes six microseconds to travel a nautical mile....Much much closer.

8) Sound travels 1100 feet per second. Semi close.

9) Peak-to-peak voltage to RMS voltage.....about 3:1.

10) Incandescent lamp: 10X the resistance at full brilliance than at room temperature. Remember this when building dummy loads!

11) Velocity factor of average coax....about 66% YMMV

12) Euler's number: about 2.7

13) Degrees per radian....about 57

14) Square root of 2 = 1.4.....close enough for government work.

15) A US bill is 6" long

\*Just in case you did not get this, think "Rule of thumb".
