
June 18 HARC Meeting

While some will treat it as a contest, other groups use the opportunity to practice their emergency response capabilities. The contest part is simply to contact as many other stations as possible and to learn to operate our radio gear in abnormal situations and less than optimal conditions.

We use these same skills when we help with events such as marathons and bike-a-thons; fundraisers such as walk-a-thons; celebrations such as parades; and exhibits at fairs, malls and museums these are all large, preplanned, non-emergency activities. But despite the development of very complex, modern communications systems — or maybe because they ARE so complex — ham radio has been called into action again and again to provide communications in crises when it really matters. Amateur Radio people (also called "hams") are well known for our communications support in real disaster and post-disaster situations.




Philadelphia area Ham Radio operators celebrate July 4th holiday with 13 Colonies Special Event

Amateur radio stations operating from the 13 original U.S. colonies will be joined by members of several Philadelphia area amateur radio clubs to celebrate Independence Day from the city where independence was declared, Philadelphia, PA.

The six day event, June 30 – July 5, allows amateur radio operators around the world to learn about the original 13 colonies and the city where Independence began. This will be the sixth year members of the Holmesburg Amateur Radio Club (HARC) will be participating. Also participating will be members of the Philmont Mobile, Drexel University, and Pottstown Area Amateur Radio Club Amateur Radio Clubs, and the Philadelphia Digital Radio Association. The theme for the 2016 event is Colonial Soldiers of the Revolution. Each of the original 13 colonies will be represented by a special event amateur radio station, K2A-K2M. The Philadelphia group, using the call WM3PEN, will offer a special QSL card featuring the Tomb of the Unknown Revolutionary War Soldier. Also this year GB13COL will be on from Durham, England. Banner. In all you can collect 15 QSL cards during the 6 day event and earn a nice certificate.

There will be several new aspects to this year's event. WM3PEN will be on the air from Independence National Historical Park on July 3. Pete, K0BAK, will be participating in the National Parks of the Air as well as the 13 Colonies. Thanks to members of the Philadelphia Digital Radio Association, WM3PEN will be on D-STAR and Fusion. They will be on the air from 7PM – 11PM EDT. In the Philadelphia area they will be on the K3PDR repeater. This year the will be joining in on the fun.


THE GOVERNOR

Stamps For the Wounded

HARC members will start collecting postage stamps for the Stamps For the Wounded program. *Stamps for the Wounded* accepts any U.S. or foreign stamps that are not torn or damaged. They have also requested each stamp should have at least a quarter-inch margin around the stamp. Do not try to either to peel or steam the stamp off the original envelope.

So save the stamps from your qsl cards or other mail. They do not need the common Flag Forever stamp. Bring the stamps to a club meeting and give them to Rich, AB3EO, who will mail them.

Pennsylvania "67" Challenge Award

Amateur Radio operators around the world have the opportunity to participate in the Pennsylvania "67" Challenge. The Challenge, sponsored by the Holmesburg Amateur Radio Club, is to make contact with all 67 Pennsylvania Counties. The Challenge is open to all amateur radio operators regardless of individual station capabilities. All contacts must be 2-way communications made in real time. These contacts may be on any Amateur Radio band/mode.

Contacts made using repeating devices such as FM repeaters, Amateur satellites, moonbounce, and keyboard-to-keyboard contacts through digipeaters/nodes are valid, because these QSOs are made in real or near-real time. Contacts using IRLP, Echolink, or D-Star are valid as long as a radio is being used by both operators. All contacts must be made from the same county.

As an incentive Pennsylvania "67" Challenge certificates may be earned by working stations in 20, 40, 60, or all 67 Counties. Paper or electronic QSLs are acceptable. The contacts can be verified by a local club officer or mailed to the Holmesburg Amateur Radio Club.

Kimberton Hamfest Saturday, July 9


The 2016 MARC Hamfest will be held on Saturday July 9, 2015 at the Kimberton Fire Company grounds, Route 113 (742 Pike Springs Road) south of the intersection with Route 23 in Kimberton, PA. The maps show that Kimberton is northwest of King of Prussia and just west of Phoenixville, PA. Talk-in is available on the MARC linked repeater systems with coverage to the north and west and near Kimberton provided by 145.13 MHz PL 131.8 repeater in Paoli PA and to the south and east by 147.06 MHZ PL 131.8 repeater in Newtown Square PA. Doors open for sellers at 0700 and for buyers at 0800. Admission is still only \$6 which it has been for decades and entitles you to a door prize ticket. Sellers have an outdoor tailgate space for \$6 (one car width, head -in parking) not including admission. An indoor table with electricity service is available for \$10 each for 1 to 4 tables or \$8 each for 5 or more tables not including admission. Reservations for indoor tables are required: kf3cd@arrl.net

QSL card checking for the ARRL DXCC and WAS awards will be available while you wait, saving you the time and expense of mailing your valuable QSL cards to the ARRL. QSL bureau envelopes will also be available for purchase.

Food and beverage sales are provided by authorized vendors only. Unlicensed children and spouse with a licensed Ham admission are free.
