Philadelphia area Ham Radio operators celebrated July 4th holiday with 13 Colonies Special Event

Amateur radio stations operating from the 13 original U.S. colonies were joined by members of several Philadelphia area amateur radio clubs to celebrate Independence Day from the city where independence was declared, Philadelphia, PA.

The six day event allowed amateur radio operators around the world to learn about the original 13 colonies and the city where independence began. This was the fifth year members of the Holmesburg Amateur Radio Club (HARC) participated. Also participating were members of the Philmont Mobile, Drexel University, and Mt. Airy (Packrats) VHF Clubs along with the Philadelphia Digital Radio Association.

The theme for the 2015 event was Founders and Patriots of the Republic. Each of the original 13 colonies were represented by a special event amateur radio station, K2A-K2M. The Philadelphia group, used WM3PEN, and offered a special QSL card featuring JohnTrunbull's painting of the Declaration of the Independence. In addition, GB13COL, was on from England. In all you could collect 15 QSL cards during the 6 day event and earn a nice certificate.

Many qsl cards have comments that they enjoyed operating the event. For some it was their first event. Others reminisced about their time in Philadelphia. In some cases family members worked all of the 13 Colonies stations.




Registration begins at 7pm.


HF AWARDS MANAGER

Stamps For the Wounded




HARC members are collecting postage stamps for the Stamps For the Wounded program. *Stamps for the Wounded* accepts any U.S. or foreign stamps that are not torn or damaged. They have also requested each stamp

should have at least a quarter-inch margin around the stamp. Do not try to either to peel or steam the stamp off the original envelope.

So save the stamps from your qsl cards or other mail. They do not need the common Flag Forever stamp. Bring the stamps to a club meeting and give them to Rich, AB3EO, who will mail them.

Many stations, including DX, included extra stamps with their qsl cards for WM3PEN that we are able to pass onto the SFTW program.



13 Colonies – 2016

The 2016 - 13 Colonies Special Event will honor colonial soldiers of the Revolution. The event will run July 1 - 6. 2015 saw an increase in cw operations, partially because of poor band conditions. We'll be looking at increasing our cw activity.

Getting Ready for the Pope

We're still wrapping up activities from the 13 Colonies event and in less than 2 months the much anticipated World Meeting of Families and the visit of Pope Francis to Philadelphia and the Holmesburg section of the city will be upon us. The World Meeting of Families takes place September 22 -25 and the Pope will be here September 26-27. One of the Pope's stops will be at the prison in the Holmesburg section of the City.

Several special event stations will be on the air while the Pope is in the U.S. visiting Washington, D.C., New York City, and Philadelphia.

The Potomac Valley Radio Club (PVRC) and the Frankford Radio Club (FRC) plan on having stations on the air for the entire week. The FRC will have W3FRC/WMF during their operation. Some FRC members will be using K2P or N2P. PVRC plan to use K3P, N3P, and W4P in celebration of the Pope's visit. They are planning on having at least 2 QSL cards. A certificate will be issued acknowledging the stations you worked.

In Philadelphia

WM3PEN will be on the air beginning Thursday night Sept 24 (0000 GMT Sept 25) until Sunday night Sept 27 (2359 GMT). A special qsl card will be available. WM3PEN will be on the certificate mentioned above. We are looking for operators.

Also W3P has been reserved by KA3LKM in South Philadelphia. Details of his operation can be found by looking at W3P on qrz.com.

Pennsylvania "67" Challenge Award

Amateur Radio operators around the world have the opportunity to participate in the Pennsylvania "67" Challenge. The Challenge, sponsored by the Holmesburg Amateur Radio Club, is to make contact with all 67 Pennsylvania Counties. The Challenge is open to all amateur radio operators regardless of individual station

capabilities. All contacts must be 2-way communications made in real time. These contacts may be on any Amateur Radio band/mode.

Contacts made using repeating devices such as FM repeaters, Amateur satellites, moonbounce, and keyboard-to-keyboard contacts through digipeaters/nodes are valid, because these QSOs are made in real or near-real time. Contacts using IRLP, Echolink, or D-Star are valid as long as a radio is being used by both operators. All contacts must be made from the same county.

As an incentive Pennsylvania "67" Challenge certificates may be earned by working stations in 20, 40, 60, or all 67 Counties. Paper or electronic QSLs are acceptable. The contacts can be verified by a local club officer or mailed to the Holmesburg Amateur Radio Club.

The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2015: Politicians *Do* Listen, ARRL President Says

ARRL President Kay Craigie, N3KN, said in the July <u>ARRL Legislative Update Newsletter</u> that Washington politicians <u>are</u> paying attention to League members who have contacted lawmakers to urge their cosponsorship of the Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2015. Essentially identical bills have been introduced in both the US House (<u>H.R. 1301</u>) and Senate (<u>S. 1685</u>). Both measures would direct the FCC to extend its rules relating to reasonable accommodation of Amateur Service communications to private land-use restrictions.

"Many visits have been made to the offices of Senators and Congressmen on behalf of H.R. 1301 and S. 1685 by members of the ARRL Board and ARRL Headquarters staff," President Craigie said. "ARRL Section Managers have encouraged members to speak out. ARRL

members around the country have talked with your elected officials in their home-district offices and town hall meetings. This is a full-team advocacy effort." To date, H.R. 1301 has attracted 86 cosponsors; the just-introduced Senate bill, S. 1685, has one original cosponsor.

President Craigie said The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2015 is aimed at helping to ensure the future of Amateur Radio, as more and more neighborhoods impose deed restrictions that prohibit Amateur Radio antennas and keep today's youngsters from becoming active radio amateurs.

"What if their parents have bought houses in neighborhoods with deed restrictions prohibiting antennas?" she speculated. "Those kids' interest in ham radio gained from school, Scouts, or family friends will have no way to blossom into the lifechanging experience of being radio amateurs."

ARRL members, she continued, "are working together so that both today's amateurs and the kids who will be amateurs in the future have the chance to operate from their homes." Letters from members urging support of the bills are what make the difference between being ignored and being heard on Capitol Hill.

"Earlier this year, I visited a North Carolina Congressman's office and got a friendly reception -- but no cosponsorship," President Craigie recounted. "More recently, another ARRL person followed up at the same office, with the same staff member, but with about 40 letters in hand. The Congressman became a cosponsor."

The newsletter suggested several ways ARRL members can get involved in the Amateur Radio Parity Act grassroots effort. One idea is to have a "letter party" at your next club meeting.

Take pre-addressed copies of letters to all three of your

for each Member of Congress. Have enough copies, so that each individual can sign his or her own letter. In some cases, club members in a given area may reside in more than one Congressional district.

Names and addresses of US House and Senate members are available on the ARRL website. Mail the collected letters to the ARRL (c/o The Amateur Radio Parity Act, ARRL, 225 Main St, Newington, CT 06111), which will collate them for hand delivery on Capitol Hill.

Members also may e-mail their lawmakers, post comments on their US House or Senate member's website, or call their lawmakers on the telephone. Be courteous, make your points, and be brief. In all cases, thank lawmakers for considering your point of view.

"Grassroots politics is about you -- the individual -- making your voice heard," the July *Legislative Update* pointed out. "It requires a good deal of preparation and effort to achieve the end results."

The League now has a <u>combined web page</u> to accommodate activities on behalf of both the House and Senate bills. The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2015 is <u>H.R. 1301</u> in the US House of Representatives and <u>S. 1685</u> in the US Senate. The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2015 page provides a clearing house for all information on these identical pieces of legislation.

FCC Announces Enforcement Bureau Field Office Reorganization Plans

Forced under political pressure to take a few steps back from its initial proposal to eliminate two-thirds of its Enforcement Bureau field offices, the FCC has announced its final, scaled-down plan to reorganize its field resources. In an *Order* released July 16, the Commission said it would close 11 of its 24 field offices, including Philadelphia, and relocate three others to nearby FCC-owned sites. In slimming down its field resources and upgrading those that remain, the FCC said it was acting in the name of efficiency and economy as well as to modernize a system model adopted 2 decades ago.

"Since then, technological changes and increasingly limited resources have created the need to take a fresh look at the [Enforcement]

Bureau's field operations," the FCC *Order* said. The FCC said it has completed "a full review" of

the field organization and concluded that it needs to concentrate its field resources "in urban areas, where the need for them is greatest."



ARRL CEO David Sumner, K1ZZ, addressed the topic of

the FCC's planned field office closures in his "It Seems to Us" editorial in the August edition of *QST*. "The challenges the FCC faces in policing the radio spectrum are greater than ever and increasing every day," Sumner wrote. "Now is hardly the time to reduce its enforcement resources."

Sumner allowed, however, that the success of the FCC's enforcement efforts is not measured in the number of field offices but in the program's effectiveness in deterring bad on-the-air behavior and resolving interference complaints from such sources as power lines and "grow lamp" ballasts.

In a news release, the FCC said its field reorganization plan "aligns the field's structure, operations, expenses, and equipment with the agency's priorities," such as RF interference. "It also prepares the field [organization] to address future enforcement needs in an ever more complex spectrum environment, and aligns field operations to support this mission," the statement continued. "Through this plan, the Commission is maintaining a commitment to respond in a timely manner to interference issues anywhere in the nation...within one day."

The Philadelphia office was originally in the Federal Building in Center City. In the late 1970s it moved its office to Oxford Valley. Many hams who got their license before the volunteer examination program can remember showing up at the FCC office, entering a room, and taking the test.
