

YLRL CONVENTION '82

We think it was the greatest group of Amateurs that ever got together! If you missed the YLRL convention in June, you missed a great affair. Even the weatherman cooperated.

There were organized activities from Thursday, June 17, through Tuesday, June 22. But this group would have had a good time if there hadn't been any activities planned for them. It was the fellowship of meeting old friends and new that was important.

They came from as far away as Bombay, India; Japan, Sweden, Holland, Germany, England and Bermuda. Our one big disappointment was that SF2FF was not able to get an exit permit from Poland. There were 178 licensed YLS registered and a total attendance - including the OMs and guests - of 251.

Due to the complexity of the circuitry in the COR Board, and the circuitry that had to be added, we solved 2 problems and created another which by now everyone should know and love. YOU MUST LET THE CARRIER DROP SO THE TIMER WILL RESET, OR ELSE. I can assure you this problem will be changed. Other than these problems, the repeater and remote link are working very well. The input may be down for a short while, so we can rework the grounding in the supply, so to prevent ground loops. The crystal that was ordered from Sentry Mfg. for the back-up motorola micor go lost, so the crystal has to be reordered. Well enough for now, just keep thinking positive.
